

# TRANSITION PERIOD

## Front Facing

- Students should move between classes in the same direction during transitions to reduce face-to-face interaction.

## Traffic

- High school hallways will be one directional. Outdoor sidewalks may be used (weather permitting) during passing periods to decrease the number of students in the hallways. Teachers will supervise these outside doors to maintain security and safety.
- Schools will have social distancing markers on the floor to remind students to remain 6 feet apart.
- Teachers who can rotate to the classroom in order to reduce the movement of students.

## Doors

- To reduce the number of touch points, classroom doors will be open.
- Sanitizer will be placed inside each outside entrance for use upon entering the building.

## Visitor Policies

- Visitors will be minimized as much as possible.
- Any persons needing to enter the buildings will go through the same screening process as staff and students.

## Lockers

- Lockers will not be used. Students will carry necessary materials in a backpack or will be left in the classrooms.

## Restrooms

- Junior high/high school students will use the restroom during instructional time and not during transition periods.
- Grade school
  - Pre K, Kindergarten, and 1st grade will use the restrooms in their classrooms
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> grade will use old locker room restrooms or the 1<sup>st</sup> grade restrooms
  - 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> grade will use the restrooms across from the library and will always keep their static groups
  - 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade will use the restrooms in the new addition

**Movement Between Buildings**

- Junior high/high school students will eat lunch in their building. They will enter the grade school building, proceed through the cafeteria line and exit the building.
- Grade school will have specials either in the classroom, outside, or in the multipurpose room. Static groups will be maintained.
- Mrs. Mosiman will have a nurse's space in both buildings to minimize movement of students.
